Statement by Archbishop Blase J. Cupich An eye for an eye makes the whole world blind.

July 8, 2016

Again we begin our day shocked by news of lives lost overnight — this time those of five police officers working to ensure the people of Dallas could assemble in a peaceful anti-violence protest.

This latest tragedy comes directly after deaths in Louisiana and Minnesota. Every corner of our land is in the grip of terror fueled by anger, hatred and mental illness and made possible by plentiful, powerful weapons. Anyone at any time can become a victim. It is time to break the cycle of violence and retaliation, of fear and powerlessness that puts more guns in our homes and on our streets.

Our hearts and minds need to change so our country can change.

As Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. said, "Returning violence for violence multiplies violence, adding deeper darkness to a night already devoid of stars. Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that."

Let us assemble in love to embrace the mourning and lost among us.

Let us assemble in brotherhood to learn what unites us and put aside what divides us.

Let us assemble in strength and keep assembling until our leaders have the courage to take the actions that will make these tragedies less likely.

Let us pause today to remember not only these officers, but the principle of non-violence they died protecting.

And pledge, in their memory, to overcome hate and violence and work for peace today and every day.

"THE BETTER PART"

In our everyday lives we often have many concerns. We are busy with caring for our children, our parents, or others. Sometimes work comes home with us, absorbing our thinking and attention. Financial concerns, health concerns, and relationship concerns fill our minds and hearts. We try to be calm. We try to be present to others. We try to pray and we find our attention returning over and over to our concerns.

Abraham becomes very busy caring for visitors who turn out to be sacred visitors. Martha is very "burdened with much serving." She cannot understand why her sister, Mary, does not help her. Jesus tells her, "Mary", who is sitting at His feet listening, "has chosen the better part." What is so special about Mary's choice?

What is the "better part?" Mary chose to listen to Jesus. This listening seems to be a way she had a special relationship with Jesus. Martha was not serving with a joyful heart. Martha, perhaps, in her serving, was not giving God any place in her ministry of service. What is the choice of the "better part" in our lives? Is it only "sitting at the feet of Jesus?" Is there another way to have the same attentive presence to the Lord no matter what we are doing? Are we doing the ministry or service for ourselves or are we doing it for God? Where is our focus? Can we have a caring, attentive presence in our hearts? Can we turn our hearts to Jesus as we do what we are doing? Can we pay attention to the other? Can we joyfully serve? Which sister are we like? Sometimes we may be like both of them. What is the "better part" in your life? How do you maintain an orientation to that "Better part?"

NOTICE: ISSUANCE OF NEW PARKING PERMITS FOR CHURCH LOT

We are in the process of issuing new parking permits for the St. Therese Church Parking Lot, effective September 1, 2016. **Permits are issued only to registered parishioners and school staff, and are non-transferable**. The new permit is green in color and the fee is \$30, renewable every 2 years.

If you have not received a letter of renewal notice, and the Parking License Permit application agreement in the mail, please see Darlene Chan-Lowe.

For your convenience, a table will be set up in the community room to obtain the new permit on Saturday, August 27th, after the 5:00pm Mass, and Sunday, August 28th, after the 8am and 9:30am Masses, until 2pm. If you cannot make it on these dates, please stop by the church office with your completed application and the \$30 fee to obtain the new permit.

Beginning on September 1, 2016, your yellow permit will no longer be valid. Any vehicle failing to display the **new GREEN** permit after this date will be towed at the owner's expense.

Northwest Suburban Respect Life Activities – The Northwest Families for Life needs more vigil workers and sidewalk counselors to help the women in three Chicago-land abortion clinics. They are in Downers Grove (Access Health, 1700 75th St.), Glen Ellyn (Aanchor Medical, 186 Roosevelt Rd.), and Wood Dale (Advantage Medical, 203 E. Irving Park Rd.). During the month of June, they estimated that 68 helpless children were lost at these places; however, there were also 2 SAVES.
