#### **Celebrating Lunar New Year 2017**

For countries and people who celebrate Lunar New Year, we know well that New Year is a time for family gathering and for exchanging well-wishes among families, relatives, and friends. The gatherings and wishes are expressed through different forms, such as sharing an extraordinarily well-prepared meal, paying a special visit to one's relatives, or giving a red envelope.

Another important expression is hanging up Chinese couplets at the doors of and inside one's house. This year our parish made two new couplets: one for the Church main entrance doors and one for the walls beside the altar.

The couplet beside the main door of the Church reads and can be translated as follows:

天程有路年年进。主宠无涯日日新。

On the journey to heaven there is a way on which we must advance every year; the grace of the Lord is boundless and new every day.

The couplet beside the altar reads and can be translated as follows:

万物逢春更舊象。群伦德救荷新恩。

All things meeting spring alter their old appearance; and all natural relationships finding salvation say thanks for the new favors.

These two couplets are reminders that new things are happening in our relationships and faith journey and God's abundant grace can help us advance every day and every year.

The theme for this year's celebration is *To Teach Who Christ Is*, adopted from the Archdiocese capital campaign, which reminds each of us individually and as a parish collectively of our mission in discipleship and in building up the Kingdom of God in Chinatown and beyond. Through *To Teach Who Christ Is*, our parish identified that we will continue to focus on the works of Evangelization, Chinese Apostolate, formation, and finding ways to increase our resources.

# The Most Powerful Prayer: Offering up the Eucharist for Someone Else

In all my years as a convert, I've learned many prayers. It was during a most difficult time in my life that I learned to offer up the Eucharist for someone else.

Our parish was going through a consolidation and my husband and I were struggling not only with the changes, but with some of the people involved. I was pregnant with our daughter and my emotions were raw.

I felt unworthy to receive the Eucharist because of my feelings towards the people we were working with, but I had a concern for our baby's health so I offered up my Communion for her.

We eventually left the parish. It was never a question of leaving the Catholic Church, but of finding one where we could practice our faith again without distraction. We wanted to heal from the lies and disrespect. It took a while, but we were able to move on.

What was the result of offering up the Eucharist for our daughter? She is an adult now who attends Mass, practices and defends her faith.

When another family member experienced a crisis recently, I remembered the most powerful prayer and I offered up my Communion for them also. That person is now in the process of healing.

On the Feast day of St. Alphonsus Liguori (August 1), I read these words of this great saint in the Magnificat:

"If you desire to find him immediately, see – he is quite close to you. Tell him what you desire, for it is to console you and grant your prayer that he remains in the tabernacle."

#### And this:

... hear Mass every day; practice mental prayer and the visitation of the most Holy Sacrament; go to Communion at least once a week; fly from evil conversations; walk always with God; and you shall see that, by such a life, you will enjoy that sweetness and peace which the world, with all it delights, has not hitherto been able to give you.

Since I've had the opportunity to attend daily Mass, I've been offering up my communion for various people. One day, as I approached the altar, I asked the Lord to save a small piece just for me.

Have you ever offered up your communion for anyone else? Were you able to witness the results?

#### **Sunday Mass Schedule Change**

With the increased activities, particularly on Sundays, our parish has been facing the challenge of the need for more space. This need was voiced during our Parish Transformation process in the year 2015 and it becomes more evident now. In order to solve this "good problem," and after so much consultation and prayers, I decided to change our Sunday 9:30am Mass to 10:30am, effective on Sunday March 5<sup>th</sup>, the First Sunday of Lent.

This new schedule will allow our Religious Education students to have their Sunday class from 9:15am to a few minutes before the 10:30am mass. Below are a few advantages for this change:

- 1. The Religious Education (R. E.) classrooms will be available for meetings, RCIA classes, and Bible Sharing, taking place after the 10:30am mass.
- 2. The R. E. students and catechists will be able to join our community events scheduled after the 10:30am mass.
- 3. The R. E. student and families will have an option to attend the 8am mass before their class if the 10:30am mass is not convenient occasionally. The same applies to other members of our parish. This is partially why from Jan. 1<sup>st</sup>, 2017, we have been working to improve our 8am mass. This used to be called "express mass" has been added with full service music and hymns and altar servers. I hope this change will help our 8:00am mass attendees have a better prayer and worship experience on Sundays.
- 4. I will have time to visit our R. E. classrooms more frequently and to teach our Mandarin RCIA and Bible Sharing before the 10:30am mass as needed.
- 5. Finally, for those of you who need to catch up with your sleep-debt, you can have a late start on Sundays.

With this change, our monthly Indonesian and Mandarin mass will move to 12:00 noon on the respected Sundays and our yearly Italian Feasts with St. Rocco and SMI will be worked out accordingly. I understand that this change will affect most of you. I ask for your openness, understanding, and cooperation since at the present moment, this is the only doable-way to resolve our space constraint as our parish continues to grow.

#### "A Dark Moment in U.S. History"

Last week Cardinal Blase Cupich said President Donald Trump's refugee ban is "a dark moment in U.S. historv."

As quoted in the Jesuit review America Magazine by Michael O'Loughlin January 29, 2017, the Cardinal said "This weekend proved to be a dark moment in U.S. history."

"The executive order to turn away refugees and to close our nation to those, particularly Muslims, fleeing violence, oppression and persecution is contrary to both Catholic and American values, "he said.

"We are told this is not the 'Muslim ban' that had been proposed during the presidential campaign, but these actions focus on Muslim-majority countries," the Cardinal said.

"They make an exception for Christians and non-Muslim minorities, but not for Muslims refugees fleeing for their lives," he said.

"The world is watching as we abandon our commitments to American values," he said.

"These actions give aid and comfort to those who would destroy our way of life. They lower our estimation in the eyes of the many peoples who want to know America as a defender of human rights and religious liberty, not a nation that targets religious populations and then shuts its doors on them," he said.

"It is time to put aside fear and join together to recover who we are and what we represent to a world badly in need of hope and solidarity," the Cardinal said.
