Silence

Cardinal Cupich calls us to spend more in silence this Lent, particularly during Mass after Communion. Why is silence so important for our well-being and growth? I came across the following helpful insights from some spiritual masters.

"Be still, and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10).

We need to find God, and he cannot be found in noise and restlessness. God is the friend of silence. See how nature - trees, flowers, grass- grows in silence; see the stars, the moon and the sun, how they move in silence... We need silence to be able to touch souls.




"COME OUT!"

When we go to wakes of family members and loved ones it can be very difficult. We feel like Martha and Mary, "Lord, if you had been here my brother would not have died." We prayed. We asked God to heal the person and yet they died. We say, "They are in a better place." While we know that and our faith tells us we will see them again, our natural response is that of loss and grief.

In this story we are told the Jesus loved Mary, Martha, and their brother Lazarus. He often would come to their home and stay. I'm sure there were many stories shared, meals eaten together, and comfortable, good times enjoyed together. We remember the many good times we had with those whom we loved who have died. Jesus came to the tomb and some translations of the Bible say, "and Jesus wept", at being at Lazarus' grave.

In each of us there may be those places in our lives, or in our personal self which may not yet come to life. There are those places we know that still need to change or they can lead to separation from God, sin. There are gifts or talents we are too hesitant or frightened to try and develop. Sometimes we must risk trying things we have never done to see if we have the gift or talent for that ministry. Standing to the side and saying "no, I could never do that" does not bring us, or the Church, new life, transforming opportunities which can lead to change and growth in our spiritual life. Those places and skills we refuse to develop are like areas which are dying or dead. Jesus stood before the tomb of Lazarus after the stone had been taken away. After praying to God, "Jesus cried out in a LOUD voice, Lazarus, COME OUT." Lazarus, who had been dead, came out, alive. Will we ask and allow Jesus to stand before us, and bring us to fuller or new life? Will we ask Jesus to call us into fuller life? In us Jesus will say, "Come out" into fullness and newness of life.
