Scripture and Eucharist

As we continue to hear the stories of the appearances of the Risen Lord, today's story of the road to Emmaus is a powerful reminder of the journey of our faith. After Jesus' horrifying crucifixion, two of his disciples were on their way to Emmaus, fleeing away from Jerusalem. Little did they know, the Risen Lord accompanied them on their journey and shared with them on the things happened with Jesus. Referring Jesus in all the Scriptures, they were impressed with his knowledge. In fact, their hearts were burning and so they invited him to stay with them. It was until later when they broke bread together, then their eyes were opened and they recognized the Risen Lord.

In reflecting this Scriptural passage, Pope Francis wrote:

The road to Emmaus thus becomes a symbol of our journey of faith: the Scriptures and the Eucharist are the indispensable elements for encountering the Lord. We too often go to Sunday mass with our worries, difficulties and disappointments....life sometimes wounds us and we go away feeling sad, towards our "Emmaus," turning our backs on God's plan. We distance ourselves from God. But the Liturgy of the Word welcomes us: Jesus explains the "Scriptures to us and rekindles in our hearts the warmth of faith and hope, and in Communion he gives us strength. ... This is what happened to the disciples of Emmaus: they received the Word; they shared the breaking of Bread and from feeling sad and defeated they became joyful. Dear brothers and sisters, the Word of God and the Eucharist fill us with joy always. Remember it well!! When you are sad, take up the Word of God and go to Sunday Mass and receive Communion, to participate in the mystery of Jesus. The Word of God, the Eucharist: they fill us with joy.

I found Pope Francis' interpretation of the story to be very helpful. I hope his wisdom can inspire you as you continue to open the Scriptures and break the bread.



"FAITH, Mercy's Gift"

There are times in our lives when people give us gifts or when people are unexpectedly kind to us. We feel we do not deserve this kindness and we may be surprised. We are very grateful.

God has given us the gift of FAITH. We have done nothing to deserve it. It is like all gifts. It is not something we earned, nor can faith be bought or bargained for. God freely, generously, and unconditionally gives it to us. Why do we receive this priceless gift and others do not? We do not know. It is God, in His loving mercy, who freely gives us this gift.

The disciples and apostles gradually grew in this gift of faith that Jesus was giving them. In today's Gospel, we hear of Jesus showing them Himself risen from the dead. This is a powerful and new dimension, challenging them and leading them to deeper faith. Thomas missed the first appearance but Jesus returns perhaps especially for Thomas. Thomas says unless he touches Jesus wounds, he will not believe. In an expression of His mercy and love, Jesus tells Thomas to touch His hands and side..."do not be unbelieving but believe." Thomas responds with a deep faith, "My Lord and my God."

God has given us this same gift of faith. It is one of the many ways God shows us His love and mercy through Jesus. Do you treasure this gift? Do you try to grow in Faith? Do you ask God for more faith? Do you ever study or read about our faith to learn more? When opportunities are given to understand more deeply the mysteries of our faith, do you stay for the talks? Think about and look at your gift of faith. Will you respond from the depths of your heart and soul like Thomas? "My Lord and my God!"
