Easter Triduum

What is the meaning of the word Triduum? Triduum is a Latin word and it literally means three days. According to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, Easter Triduum is described as follows:

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum—from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil.

The liturgical services that take place during the Triduum are:

Mass of the Lord's Supper Good Friday of the Lord's Passion Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord

As we journey into the most meaningful celebrations of the gifts of the Eucharist and priesthood, and of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, I invite you and your families and friends to join us for this Easter Triduum's celebrations:





Reflection of the Cantonese Retreat by Florence Yu

"PRAYER FOR EASTER"

When we prepare for an important celebration such as Thanksgiving, we use the days or weeks before the day to prepare, clean, invite and even start to cook. When we know a person is ill and may soon die, if we love them, we spend time with them. We prepare favorite foods or play special music they like. We spend time with them, wanting to be there as much as we can.

Holy Week is that kind of time. The scriptures and celebrations of this week all are ways of accompanying Jesus to the Cross and ultimately to Resurrection, Easter. In your mind and heart, you can walk this week with Jesus as He goes to Jerusalem. Each Mass of the day, Monday through Wednesday, has special readings. Then we reach Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter.

How can you "walk with Jesus" specially this week? The scripture readings for each of the Masses during Holy Week, can be found on the Bishop's website USCCB. Click readings when the site comes up. Then you just follow the calendar. By choosing the day's date you will find the readings of the day. This is the HOLIEST week of the year. The days of Thursday, Friday and Saturday all have VERY special celebrations.

Thursday we remember the Last Supper of Jesus and His apostles. Come, have your feet washed. Remember your first Communion as we celebrate the institution of the Holy Eucharist and Priesthood. Good Friday we walk the Way of The Cross (stations) as Jesus carries the cross up the hill to be nailed to it. We will have stations at 3PM. In the evening's brief Prayer Service, we hear the story of Jesus suffering, death and burial, honor the cross and receive the Eucharist. Holy Saturday we celebrate the Resurrection and "New Life" in our parish community by being with the catechumens as they receive Baptism, Holy Eucharist, and Confirmation. The Mass is filled with symbols, special actions, and music. Give the St. Therese Community the pleasure of your company. Open yourself though these celebrations, to the multitude and depth of graces God wants to give you. Do not say, "I am too busy." Jesus was not too busy to show you His
