#### **Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus**

This past Friday, we celebrated the Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. This month is known as the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Devotion to the Sacred Heart has begun since the year 1672. "On repeated occasions, Jesus appeared to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, a Visitation nun, in France, and during these apparitions He explained to her the devotion to His Sacred Heart as He wanted people to practice it: He asked to be honored in the symbol of His Heart of flesh; He asked for acts of reparation, for frequent Communion, Communion on the First Friday of the month, and the keeping of the Holy Hour."

Traditionally, we believe that Jesus made 12 promises to those who practice this special devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The 12 promises are:

- (1) I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
- (2) I will establish peace in their homes.
- (3) I will comfort them in all their afflictions.
- (4) I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.
- (5) I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
- (6) Sinners will find in my heart the source and Infinite Ocean of mercy.
- (7) Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.
- (8) Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
- (9) I will bless every place in which an image of my heart is exposed and honored.
- 10) I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
- (11) Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in my Heart.
- (12) I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in my disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. My divine heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.

In our parish, we have begun 1<sup>st</sup> Friday devotions two years ago. On the first Friday of each month, we have Holy Hour with exposition of the most Holy Eucharist, recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplets, and Benediction. I encourage you to participate in this very prayerful and spiritual devotion.

#### **Promoting the RCIA through Threshold Conversations**

Sister Caritas recently recounted her unique experience of her ride home from Midway Airport. "After sharing tidbits from our journeys of faith, the Holy Spirit inspired me to invite the person I was sitting with on the plane to share a ride home. To my surprise, her husband was waiting at the gate and they dropped me off right at my front door!"

This story, I believe, highlights important qualities for RCIA recruitment:

- 1. Everything good and holy is born out of a relationship.
- 2. Strangers are just friends we have not yet met.
- 3. Sharing one's faith with a stranger is an effective way to break the ice in a conversation.
- 4. God often surprises his friends when they are courageous and witness their faith with others.

The most effective way to promote the RCIA is to have what is called a "threshold conversation." The goal of threshold conversations is not to preach, catechize, judge, or defend a particular Church dogma or doctrine, but rather to listen lovingly and carefully to "the seeds of faith" in others.

I encourage each of you reach out to someone this week with a threshold conversation. Sister established a new relationship through her threshold conversations. The more threshold conversations, the more seeds are planted for RCIA. RCIA flyers can be found in the entrance area of the Church.

#### St. Therese College Scholarship Application







#### "God Values Us with Infinite Love"

One of the Societies that exist in our society is the Audubon Society. The people in this group are concerned for birds. There are many people who do bird watching and count how many of a certain kind of bird they see. Some others look for a variety of birds.

In today's reading Jesus is speaking to His disciples and tells them about sparrows. In our country sparrows are one of the very common birds. They are small and brown. We see them in many places. They are not one of the kinds that many people look for. They are so common people do not notice them too much. In Jesus' time sparrows could be purchased for very little. Jesus tells us that even if they seem of little worth, God knows when one of them dies. Jesus tells us we are more precious than bunches of sparrows.

Do you know how many hairs you have on your head at any given time? Jesus tells us God knows even though we do not know. Even a mother combing her child's hair does not know exactly how many hairs there are. God is so intimately concerned about us, He knows everything about us. He loves us no matter what. This can give us the assurance that we have nothing to fear. When we become afraid we can remember how much God cares for us like the birds of the air or the lilies of the field. God's loving care and support is always around us. "So do not be afraid; you are worth more (to God) than many sparrows."
