From Styrofoam to Paper



In 1986, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) "released a report that listed the polystyrene manufacturing process as the fifth largest creator of hazardous waste... It takes 500 years to decompose, and it takes up 25-30% of our world's landfills." Styrene is very difficult to recycle. [1] In fact, many recyclers don't even accept styrofoam containers "because they're so lightweight—recyclers base the profitability of recycling products by weight. If they don't end up buried in

landfills, they blow away and wind up in oceans, where they never break down."[2] Our lakes, waterways, and oceans are suffering due to styrofoam waste. There are 57 chemical by-products released during the manufacturing of styrene, polluting our air, lands, waterways, and communities that live near the facilities. "Styrofoam is no longer manufactured with CFC (notorious ozone-depleting chemical), but still uses HFCs (hydrofluorocarbons) that are still linked to depleting the ozone layer and affecting global warming."[1] "Polystyrene foam (styrofoam) is easy to spot, but polystyrene is also used in nonfoam food containers, including clear-plastic clamshells and coffee-cup lids." You can avoid polystyrene altogether by **looking for the number 6** inside the chasing-arrow recycling symbol usually imprinted on the bottom of its containers and products. [2]

of hope, love and courage in my own life to be a missionary disciple. When we are in relationship with God, anything is possible.



"NOTHING IS IMPOSSIBLE"

Do you every watch the news or listen to the daily radio broadcast of what is happening in our society and with our world today? We can hear all the evil and bad things that are happening and be very disturbed by it. In one way I am glad that bad and evil things are still news. I am not happy about the frantic mindset that this continuous repetition creates in us. We can come to think that there is only evil or bad things in our world. We can see "Only WEEDS" that "the enemy has sown." Yet if we go out and look for ourselves, we can find countless people who are helping others, who are caring about situations, who are donating monies for the cures, for earth quake victims, for flood victims, for people in need of help. Truly those people are the "good seed".

In the Gospel today, Jesus tells a story about a man who planted good seed and when things start to grow, the helpers find weeds all through the field as well as good growth. The helpers want to tear out the weeds but the farmer tells them to wait until harvest unless the pulling up of the weeds also destroys the good plants. We can often look at others and the various actions that seem to have evil results and call it "weeds", evil people. We can even look at ourselves and see only our failures, our incomplete actions and efforts. We see that in us which is not all that we want it to be. These "weed thoughts" can discourage us and blind us to whom we really are. They help us to forget the generous and kind things we do. We forget the helpful kind words we say, the talents we have which we so readily give to others in need. We are like the field with good seeds and weeds growing together. God gives the grace for us to have a greater amount of good in our lives than bad. With grace and effort, time and work, we can become virtuous, holy people. We can be more good plants than weeds. We have to ask for the grace and help. We have to listen to God's word and pray. Most of all we have to trust and believe "that nothing is impossible with God." The weed of discouragement growing in our lives chokes out the good seed. The love of others and the good seed of trust in the power of God, fertilize the good ground, strengthen the good plants, and keep the weeds out. God can do wonders with us. In the Old Testament God did raise up an army out of dry, dead bones. Nothing is impossible. Peter did walk on water.
