Advent and Advent Wreaths

Next Sunday we begin a new liturgical year in the life of the Church. Advent (from, "ad-venire" in Latin or "to come to") is the season encompassing the four Sundays (and weekdays) leading up to the celebration of Christmas.

The Advent season is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time and also to the anniversary of the Lord's birth on Christmas. The final days of Advent, from December 17 to December 24, focus particularly on our preparation for the celebrations of the Nativity of our Lord (Christmas).

One of the devotions of Advent is the advent wreaths which are constructed of a circle of evergreen branches into which four candles are inserted, representing the four weeks of Advent. Ideally, three candles are purple and one is rose, but white candles can also be used.

The purple candles in particular symbolize the prayer, penance, and preparatory sacrifices and goods works undertaken at this time. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday, *Gaudete* Sunday, when the priest also wears rose vestments at Mass; *Gaudete* Sunday is the Sunday of rejoicing, because the faithful have arrived at the midpoint of Advent, when their preparation is now half over and they are close to Christmas.

The progressive lighting of the candles symbolizes the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of his second coming to judge the living and the dead.

In order to prepare our hearts and minds for the celebrations of Advent and Christmas, our parish will again offer an *Advent Retreat on Saturday Dec.* 2^{nd} . I encourage you to take advantage of this opportunity.



"JESUS, THE SHEPHERD KING" ~Sister Caritas

Kings today and long ago, are people who lead people and have many people to do what they need done for the people they rule. The King does not do it himself. The power to govern and rule goes from the father, who is King to the oldest son or daughter. Today we know Queen Elizabeth II who took over the throne of England when her Father died. There were two girls. Elizabeth was the oldest child and became Queen Elizabeth the II.

In the first reading today we hear Jesus saying that He will care for the sheep, the people. He will rescue those who are in danger and search for those who are lost. Jesus, as shepherd, will do it himself. He will not send others to search or lead or care for the people. He will be the one to do it. We can trust Him. He cares for His people.

We are His people, His sheep. Jesus is the one who wants to lead us and take us to "the kingdom of God. Sheep follow the shepherd. They will go wherever the shepherd leads them. Do you ever consider what the will of God is for you? Do you ask Jesus to lead you on the right path? Do you trust that Jesus cares for you and will lead you? And when He tries to show you the way by His words and the teachings in Scripture and in the Church, do you try to follow? Do you ever think, "Oh, I know a better way, a short cut?" In the end it may not be the best or safest path. It may not really lead to the Kingdom of God. In the end of our lives Jesus, the Shepherd, will judge us. He will ask what you did. "I tried to show you how to care for others and what to do. Did you follow?" In the end it's up to each of us.


