From the Desk of Fr. Francis

Greetings of Christ's Peace and Joy! Hope you all had a blessed week.

Thanks

Thanks to all the children who came to clean our Church last Saturday. Special thanks to **Christine** and **Joe Delfin, Jennifer Sin and Samantha Ng** for supervising them and to **Thomas Howard** for organizing it.

Thanks to all who attended the Mandarin retreat last Saturday. We had almost 30 participants. Through sharing, prayer, silence and celebrating the Eucharist, all participants had a fruitful day.



Update on Church Painting and Lighting Project

The front two side walls, lower parts of the sanctuary walls, and the east and west walls of the Church, and all cracked areas of the ceilings on both side sections of the Church have been repainted and repaired. Many commented to me on how great a job the painters have done and how beautiful it looks. The paint job is taking longer than we expected, so after New Year, the painters will resume and finish repairing the middle ceilings of our Church.

We have changed all the chandelier light bulbs into LED light bulbs a few weeks ago. Now we have found LED light bulbs and features to replace all the square halogen 500 watt light bulbs. The halogen lights are too hot for the walls. You can see burning signs around them. So far we have replaced the west section of the Church. The difference is very obvious. The LED ones are much brighter and consume much less electricity. It's expensive to replace over 30 of them, but in the long run, it will save us a lot of electricity. After New Year, we plan to replace the rest of the square halogen lights to LED lights.

Wisdom on Silence

Below are a few excerpts from the book titled, *The Power of Silence: Against the Dictatorship of Noise*, which I am reading now and I mentioned on the first Sunday of Advent. I hope the author's wisdom on silence might be helpful to the rest of your Advent journey.

"Silence is not an absence. On the contrary, it is the manifestation of a presence, the most intense of all presences. In modern society, silence has come into disrepute; this is the symptom of a serious, worrisome illness. The real questions of life are posed in silence. Our blood flows through our veins without making any noise, and we can hear our heartbeats only in silence."

"Modern life does not allow us to look calmly at things. Our eyelids remain open incessantly, and our eyes are forced to look at a sort of ongoing spectacle. The dictatorship of the image, which plunges our attention into a perpetual whirlpool, detests silence. The silence of the eyes consists of being able to close one's eyes in order to contemplate God who is in us, in the interior depths of our personal abyss."

"Silence of the heart consists of quieting little by little our miserable human sentiments so as to become capable of having the same sentiments as those of Jesus. Silence of the heart is the silence of the passions. It is necessary to die to self in order to join the son of God in silence."

"TEST EVERYTHING" ~Sister Caritas

Throughout the scholastic semester, tests are given in different subjects. Students work and study very hard to pass the tests and to get good grades. While grades are important, what you really learn and apply to your life from the subjects is even more important.

St. Paul tells us some important advice in the beginning of his letter to the Thessalonians. One piece of this is "Test everything." Paul is not talking about classroom tests. Rather, he is giving us some wise advice. Not everyone's words are true. As we hear all the confusion of the political conversation in our country, we need to observe and test the words against our real experiences. As we hear many accusations regarding sexual abuse we need to carefully test the explanation of the women and if correct, believe the women. Do not say "it is the woman's fault". That is not always true. Paul tells us test everything. If we are smart, we do not just go into a store and take a shirt or blouse and buy it without checking the size or trying it on. That is what Paul means. Test everything. In a group, especially in a classroom, the person who claims the loudest, the first one saying, "I didn't do it", is often the child who has done "the crime." Just because the other students are accusing someone, it does not always mean they are the guilty person. "Test everything." Check out the circumstances; look carefully at the event or events. Ask wise and appropriate questions. Take your time before you jump to judgment. Checking your own thoughts and testing your decisions is very important. We can be very sure we are right. We may not be right in reality.

As people and as a nation, we can be very critical of things and people. No one does it well enough, or we think our view is the only correct view or way. We need to look carefully at our own actions and thought processes. No one is right always. We need to check our actions and thoughts and words. We may need to change our behavior or the way we think. We may need to learn or study more about things. Pray to the Holy Spirit for prudence or right judgment. God will help us. If we ask God, God always helps.


