National Migration Week



The issues of immigration reform and welcoming refugees have been passionately debated and discussed in the last few years. It is still a very urgent issue to be resolved. It is shocking and sad to know that there are over 250 million migrants worldwide, of whom 22.5 million are refugees. Pope Francis in his message for 2018 World Day of Peace focused on this particular reality, calling humanity to become more and more a universal family and our earth a true "common home."

While talking about the need for us to support and be open to migrants and refugees, the Holy Father also pointed out the gifts that they shared with their new-found home:

When we turn that gaze to migrants and refugees, we discover that they do not arrive empty-handed. They bring their courage, skills, energy and aspirations, as well as the treasures of their own cultures; and in this way, they enrich the lives of the nations that receive them. We also come to see the creativity, tenacity and spirit of sacrifice of the countless individuals, families and communities around the world who open their doors and hearts to migrants and refugees, even where resources are scarce.

We are a community of migrants. Most of us can easily relate to the wisdom of the Holy Father. We experienced the needs for migrants to be welcomed, accepted, and respected. Our experiences will definitely help us to be open and supportive of migrants and refugees.

In solidarity with them, Cardinal Cupich will celebrate a mass this Sunday at Holy Name Cathedral to appreciate the gifts that the migrants bring to our local Church and to pray for those who are suffering as migrants and refugees. A few of our parish members will represent our community at the mass by leading a Prayer of the Faithful in Chinese, and by joining the opening and closing processions. Indeed, as the celebration titled, we are "many journeys but one family."

Let us continue to pray for all migrants and refugees and implore the intercession of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, "who devoted her life to the service of migrants and became their patron saint, taught us to welcome, protect, promote and integrate our brothers and sisters."

"Revelation to the Gentiles" ~Sister Caritas

Events happen in our lives all the time. Some things that happen do not seem to change our lives too much. There are things which happen and while they do not seem too important at the time, we later realized the major effect they have in our lives. For example, if I had not moved in eighth grade to St. Alphonsus Parish and gone to the school there, I would probably never have met the School Sisters of Notre Dame.

This feast today celebrates a great event which changed our lives and even changed the lives of Joseph, Mary and Jesus. The Magi came and were following a star which seemed to disappear in the area of Jerusalem. The Magi went seeking information asking, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews?" This was asked of Herold, the King. After searching for information, Herold sent them to Bethlehem and the star re-appeared as they headed to Bethlehem. After they found Jesus they were warned not to return to Herold.

Joseph is told by an angel, in a dream, to take Mary and Jesus and immediately go to Egypt in Northern Africa. They stay there for part of the early life of Jesus until Herold dies. Jesus lives His early life in a foreign land, hearing a foreign language (to Joseph and Mary), and experiencing a different culture and foods, etc. He was truly a refugee, fleeing, that He might not be killed. Several years later, the Holy Family returns to Nazareth, to their own home town.

To the gentile Magi, Jesus is revealed to people other than Jewish people. In a way He was revealed to all other peoples and ultimately to us who are non-Jews, living today. This event began the change St. Paul and the Apostles continued to the "gentiles." Though Jesus was later known as "King of the Jews" (the sign on the cross), in this feast we celebrate God revealing Jesus to all peoples.

Today we give thanks for those who faithfully handed on the faith and knowledge of the stories and teachings of Jesus. We are the inheritors. Our job is to be those who hold on to the faith, treasure and live the faith, and most importantly, hand on the Catholic faith to the members of our families and friends. It is what we are called to do. Jesus sent the apostles and us "into the whole world." "Go into the whole world and preach the Gospel to every creature baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Teach them everything I have told you and behold, I am with you all days even to the end of the world." Our role as evangelizers is unending and a very important responsibility because we are baptized Catholic Christians. In a special way it is our special feast.
