## *From the Desk of Fr. Francis*

Greetings of Christ's Peace and Joy! Hope you all had a blessed week.



### **Gazing on the Cross**

This Sunday, we meditate on the Passion of the Lord from the Gospel of Mark. The symbols of palms and cross can help us to make sense of the realities we live in as disciples. Violence, injustice and innocent death continue to hurt each of us and our World. We need healing.

The effort of *Renew My Church* reminds us all that our Church needs to refocus ourselves on the CROSS and MISSION. In the beginning of the process, Cardinal Cupich invited us all to gaze on the San Domiano Cross. As Renew My Church continues to unfold, we need keep our hearts and eyes on the Cross. While acknowledging our challenges and differences, we know that we are one Body in Christ. Jesus is calling us to carry on His mission. This great mission we all have compels us to be open and to share and to make disciples. I am grateful to all who attended our Parish Conversation on Renew My Church last Sunday. There were a lot of good and honest sharing. I am both optimistic and realistic. I know that this process is very challenging and many Catholics already feel the hurt just by discussing some of the possible changes. We need the Cross, which offers us hope and new life.

In his homily on March 20<sup>th</sup>, sharing on the story of the serpent on a pole in the Old Testament, Pope Francis noted...

how the people became frustrated by the long journey, lost hope, complained and suffered the bites of serpents. The serpents are an external system of poisoned hearts. But the people could be saved by gazing on the serpent Moses made and placed on a pole. And what was its power? "It was prophetic: it was the figure of Christ on the cross," Pope Francis said. "By looking only at their own strength, they forgot the Lord's strength, which had liberated them from 400 years of slavery." The Holy Father drew the analogy: "And here is the key to our salvation, the key for having patience on the journey of life, the key to overcome our deserts: looking at the Crucifix." Like the people in the desert healed by looking at the serpent, we can be healed by Jesus and his wounds, "for by those wounds we have been healed."



Our World needs healing; our Church needs healing; and each of us needs healing. The cross can heal us!

As we move into *Holy Week*, let's spend some time gazing on the cross and let's make the best effort to celebrate the Paschal mystery with our community:

Listed below are the initial scenarios to begin the conversation. We are asked to provide feedback on these initial scenarios and propose alternatives in the upcoming weeks.

**Initial Scenario A: 3 parishes**

- Parish 1: St. Therese Chinese Catholic Church, All Saints – St. Anthony, St. Barbara, and St. Mary of Perpetual Help would unite to form one new canonical parish.
- Parish 2: St. Jerome Croatian and Santa Lucia would unite to form one new canonical parish.
- St. Therese Chinese Catholic School would continue to explore expansion to an additional campus. Santa Lucia School would close for the 2019-20 school year. Parishes 1 and 2 would collectively support 1 school located at either St. Barbara or St. Jerome.
- Parish 3: Nativity of Our Lord and St. Gabriel would unite to form one new canonical parish. Bridgeport Catholic Academy and St. Gabriel School would serve the new parish as the new parish evaluates the sustainability of continuing both schools. The parish would need to support any operating deficits driven by low enrollment.

**Initial Scenario B: 4 parishes**

- Parish 1: St. Therese Chinese Catholic Church, All Saints – St. Anthony, and Santa Lucia would unite to form one new canonical parish. Santa Lucia Church would close for worship. St. Therese Chinese Catholic School would serve as the parish school and continue to explore expansion to an additional campus. Santa Lucia School would close for the 2019-20 school year.
- Parish 2: St. Barbara and St. Mary of Perpetual Help would unite to form one new canonical parish.
- Parish 3: St. Jerome Croatian would continue in its current canonical structure.
- Parishes 2 and 3 would collectively support 1 school located at either St. Barbara or St. Jerome.
- Parish 4: Nativity of Our Lord and St. Gabriel would unite to form one new canonical parish. Bridgeport Catholic Academy and St. Gabriel School would serve the new parish as the new parish evaluates the sustainability of continuing both schools. The parish would need to support any operating deficits driven by low enrollment.

**Initial Scenario C: 2 parishes**

- Parish 1: St. Therese Chinese Catholic Church, All Saints – St. Anthony, Santa Lucia, St. Barbara, St. Mary of Perpetual Help, Nativity of Our Lord, and St. Gabriel would all unite to form one new canonical parish. All Saints – St. Anthony and Santa Lucia Churches would close for worship.
- Parish 2: St. Jerome Croatian Parish would continue in its current canonical structure and focus on serving as a center of Croatian Catholic culture.
- St. Therese Chinese Catholic School would continue to explore expansion to an additional campus.
- St. Barbara School would serve as the school for the northern part of Bridgeport. St. Jerome and Santa Lucia Schools would close for the 2019-20 school year.
- Bridgeport Catholic Academy would serve as the school for the southern part of Bridgeport and Canaryville. St. Gabriel School would close for the 2019-20 school year.



**Initial Scenario D: 4 parishes**

- Parish 1: St. Therese Chinese Catholic Church and All Saints – St. Anthony would unite to form one new canonical parish. St. Therese Chinese Catholic School would continue exploring expansion to an additional campus.
- Parish 2: St. Mary of Perpetual Help and St. Barbara would unite to form one new canonical parish.
- Parish 3: St. Jerome Croatian and Santa Lucia would unite to form one new canonical parish.
- Parishes 2 and 3 would collectively support 1 school located at either St. Barbara or St. Jerome.
- Parish 4: Nativity of Our Lord and St. Gabriel would unite to form one new canonical parish. Bridgeport Catholic Academy and St. Gabriel School would serve the new parish as the new parish evaluates the sustainability of continuing both schools. The parish would need to support any operating deficits driven by low enrollment.

**Initial Scenario E: 3 parishes**

- Parish 1: St. Therese Chinese Catholic Church, All Saints – St. Anthony, and St. Barbara would unite to form one new canonical parish.
- Parish 2: St. Jerome Croatian and Santa Lucia would unite to form one new canonical parish.
- St. Therese Chinese Catholic School would continue to explore expansion at an additional campus.
- Parishes 1 and 2 would collectively support 1 school located at either St. Barbara or St. Jerome.
- Parish 3: St. Mary of Perpetual Help, Nativity of Our Lord and St. Gabriel would unite to form one new canonical parish. The newly formed parish would explore the sustainability of two schools and whether to move to one school at the Bridgeport Catholic Academy site. The parish would need to support any operating deficits driven by low enrollment.
