Dear St. Therese Chinese Catholic School Families and Church Parishioners,

I am writing to share news that Ms. Phyllis Cavallone will be taking a new position as Chief of Academics for the Chicago Archdiocese Office of Catholic Schools effective July 1, 2018.

While Ms. Cavallone will no longer serve as Principal of St. Therese School, both she and I want to assure you that we both remain committed to the mission of St. Therese School and that Ms. Cavallone plans to continue to support and advocate for our students in her new position at the Archdiocese. And she will stay connected with our community, including possibly mentoring the new principal. As you know, Ms. Cavallone and Ms. Oi have worked hand-in-hand for the last 15 years; Ms. Oi – and all of the teachers and staff – share Ms. Cavallone's passion and vision for St. Therese. As a team, we remain deeply committed to advancing our mission.

All of the hard work we have accomplished together is the foundation for our future success – this is a time of change but also a time of celebration and recommitment to ensuring that St. Therese School and our students continue to grow, thrive and succeed.

We are planning a Mass and luncheon of thanks and celebration for all Ms. Cavallone has done for our community on Sunday, June 24th at 10:30am. We hope you will join us to thank Ms. Cavallone and wish her well in her new role.

I will be sure to keep you informed as we move forward. You are in my prayers and I ask you to keep St. Therese in your prayers as we go through this transition. In the meantime, please feel free to contact me if you have any questions.

Respect Life Corner

SERENE ATTENTIVENESS TO GOD'S CREATION

With his encyclical *Laudato si'*, Pope Francis invites us to understand more deeply our relationships with God, one another, and the rest of creation, and to live accordingly. "Everything is connected," he reminds us (LS 91).

God uses creation to bring us into loving relationship with himself, most notably through the sacraments. We experience this most powerfully in the Eucharist, the true body and blood of Christ, received under the appearance of bread and wine, where "all that has been created finds its greatest exaltation" (LS 236). God invites us to embrace creation on this deeper level through our worship of himself (LS 235). Our relationship with Christ—strengthened by receiving him worthily in Holy Communion—helps us understand our relationships with one another and with creation.

If we are filled with the love of God, a culture of encounter and solidarity will begin to bloom. Pope Francis stresses, "We are speaking of an attitude of the heart, one which approaches life with serene attentiveness, which is capable of being fully present to someone without thinking of what comes next" (LS 226). With this attitude of heart, we neither treat other humans as disposable, nor neglect to care for God's creation at any level. Through a conversion of heart, repairing our relationships with God, one another, and all of creation, we can combat the many pollutants that poison our hearts and our world.

"THE WILL OF GOD" by Sister Caritas

Many years ago as a young Sister, I asked a friend three questions. I asked, "How do we love God, AND what does it mean to obey?" The third question was similar. I received the same answer for all three questions, "Do the Will of God." I decided that answer was important so I tried to understand and live out the answer in my every day religious life.

Over the years and especially early in my life, I have thought about that answer. After reflection, I came to understand that if we really love someone, we are willing and eager to do what they want. We try to learn what they like, what they need, what they want. It needs however, in relationships, to be a two way thing. The other person should also want to know what the other's needs, wants, likes are. It is not good for only one person to do these things and always be giving. Seeking to find the other's will and doing it, is love.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells those who were listening to Him, that the seeking of the will of God puts us in a special relationship. It may sound as if Jesus is ignoring His mother and others in His family who are asking for Him. He asks them, "Who are my Mother and my brothers?" "Whoever does the will of God is brother and sister and mother to me." No one did the will of God other than Jesus Himself, better than His mother. The first words we hear from Mary to the angel are her response of willingness to do what God wants. At the Wedding Feast she tells the servants, "Do whatever He tells you," referring to Jesus. Jesus, throughout His life, always looked for the will of His Father in Heaven. He says, "I come to do the will of Him who sent me." Many of the saints made this an important part of their lives. As followers of Jesus, we are called to imitate Him. We are called to seek and to do the Will of God. And yes, with God it is "a two way street." God does give us what we need. Sometimes God gives us what we want when we pray. God also does sometimes what we like. We are in a relationship of Love with God.


