
What is the purpose of this ministry / who is it for?

Stories from the Chinese Apostolate

What is the Chinese Apostolate? Before addressing this issue, a bit of context might be helpful.



Walking Creates the Path

Several years ago Fr. Francis met with Cardinal George to discuss the "Chinese Apostolate." While this encounter failed to produce a clear, workable definition, it did, nevertheless, foster on ongoing, parish-based discussion about what it means for St. Therese to be the "Archdiocesan Center for Chinese Apostolate."

Coming to Maturity

The term "Chinese Apostolate" began taking on greater and greater significance at St. Therese during ensuing years. First, *Keith Strom* from the Office of Evangelization critically engaged this term with parish

leaders over the course of several months in a series of formation talks. Next, the *Parish Transformation Team* wove the Chinese Apostolate into fabric of a three-year strategic plan. And finally, *Renew My Church* challenged parish and school leaders to practically demonstrate and compellingly articulate the Chinese Apostolate to both neighboring parishes and Archdiocesan leaders. The term Chinese Apostolate, thanks to hard work, has come to maturity.

Beginning of a New Era

The period of June 30, 2018 to July 1st 2019 will undoubtedly be the most exciting and life-giving period in our parishes' storied history. Thanks to creative pastoral efforts like outreach to Chinese college students, adding a Mandarin RCIA, hosting Chinese Sisters every summer, including non-Catholics in our altar server program, and implementing our summer Post Office Translation program, St. Therese Parish is ready to expand the Chinese Apostolate to other parishes and even share resources with U.S. and international parishes. Now that we are much clearer about how to enact the Chinese Apostolate in Chinatown and beyond, we should be confident that the Holy Spirit will pave a way for us to do it for years to come.

WASHINGTON— Cardinal Timothy Michael Dolan, Archbishop of New York and Chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) Committee on Pro-Life Activities, issued a

statement today inviting all people of good will to join in a prayer campaign that the change in the U.S. Supreme Court will move our nation closer to the day when every human being is protected in law and welcomed in life.

Cardinal Dolan's full statement follows:

"As soon as Supreme Court Justice Anthony Kennedy announced his retirement, pro-choice groups began lobbying the U.S. Senate to reject any nominee who does not promise to endorse Roe v. Wade. While the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops does not support or oppose the confirmation of any presidential nominee, we can and should raise grave concerns about a confirmation process which is being grossly distorted by efforts to subject judicial nominees to a litmus test of support for Roe v. Wade. And we must pray.

Each Friday [a nine-week Novena], from August 3 - September 28, 2018, I urge all people of good will to join me in prayer that this change in the U.S. Supreme Court will move our nation closer to the day when every human being is protected in law and welcomed in life.

"SOME LEFT OVER" by Sister Caritas

For two years, I lived on the reservation outside of Tucson, Arizona. The land belonged to a Tribe of Native American People called the Hoono Oatham. That is their name in their language. When I lived there they were known by an English name, Papago. We would celebrate a birthday of a member and after Mass the family would stand in a row. Each family member would have a container of different wrapped candy or oranges to share with the people who attended Mass. The family did not know the number of people who would attend. Everyone took some and there was always enough for everyone. It always reminded me of the story in today's Gospel.

In the Gospel, Jesus sees the crowd and they are hungry. Andrew finds a boy with five loaves and two fish. "But what is that among so many?" Andrew asks. Jesus has all them (5000) sit down and the bread and fish is shared till they all had enough. Twelve wicker baskets of leftovers were gathered.

In the First reading Elisha is given twelve barley loaves. He tells his servant to give it to the hungry people before him, to eat. The servant objects but the prophet persists. He quotes God. "They shall all eat and some will be left over." ...And so it was.

What about us? Do we trust in our gifts to share them generously? Have we seen the miracle of having enough when we thought we did not? Something happens and we have more that we need. Do we waste the extra or do we share it with those who have less? Are we willing to reach out and welcome others, the stranger, the one who is different? Can we make room for anyone God sends to us? Are we, each of us, individually and together build up the kingdom and feed the hungry people with the word of God and with food for their bodies? Believe God can do it through us and God will.
