

"When the Sacred Scriptures are read in the Church, God himself speaks to his people, and Christ, present in his word, proclaims the Gospel. Therefore, the readings from the Word of God are to be listened to reverently by everyone, for they are an element of the greatest importance in the Liturgy." (General Instruction of the Roman Missal [GIRM], no. 29)

"Joy is the feeling I get when I am reading at the lectern, it is truly a humbling experience to be able to proclaim the word of God and leading the congregation in a prayerful manner. Each reading that is given to us has allowed me the opportunity to reflect on how the readings can correlate to our everyday lives. Respect Life Corner

Work— Labor Day Weekend is a good time to reflect on the nature of work and its relation to our inherent dignity. St. John Paul's 1981 Encyclical *Laborem Exercen* teaches that work is "a basic dimension of human existence" (¶4), a universal vocation intended by the Creator in the command to "be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth *and subdue* it" (Gen 1:28). Work is the means by which we achieve that dominion. Work then is a key source of our dignity, for by working we follow God's design and share in his creative power, thereby manifesting his image and likeness. So, in spite of the toil and suffering, it can entail, "work is a good thing for man" (¶9), and its absence a cross for him. As St. John Paul explains it: "Through work man not only transforms nature, adapting it to his own needs, but he also achieves fulfillment as a human being and indeed, in a sense, *becomes 'more a human being'*" (Id). Put it another way: work corresponds to our dignity, expresses it and increases it. This is no small truth in a barren culture desperate for meaning. Let's thank God for the gift of work, do it well when we have it, pray for those who lack it today and work so that they'll have it tomorrow.

"Heart-filled Actions" by Sister Caritas

On St. Patrick's Day, the tradition is to wear something green. Sometimes I feel like I do not want to wear green as my heritage is not Irish. Sometimes I do it anyway contrary to what I feel. There are times in our lives when what we do is not from our "heart". We do things to please or to be accepted by some people. Teenagers often do what their peers do even if they really do not like it. The need to belong is more important than being true to them or what is right.

Our readings today talk about the difference between true worship of God and true following of the commandments and external conformity. Why do you do that kind action? Is it because someone will notice and say how kind you are? Why do you go to Church on Sunday? Is it what you really want to do? You want to worship God? Sometimes doing the right thing is hard at first but if we keep trying to do it, it becomes easier. We do it because we want to do it. Gradually we form a habit. When we don't do it we are uncomfortable. Something seems wrong with our day.

In the Gospel today, Jesus admonishes the Pharisees in their concern for external conformity to the law without an internal commitment to God. It is easy to do the external. The internal dedication of our heart to God is what is important. From the heart of a person comes evil actions or a loving way of life. We need to open our hearts wide to the grace and generosity of our God. The more we embrace the grace the more we will be filled with love and the more we will be close to God...
