Greetings of Christ's Peace and Joy! Hope you all had a blessed week.

Parish Financial and Ministerial Report for the Fiscal Year ending 6/30/2018

First of all, I would like to thank all of our Finance Council members: Nick Andriacchi, George Lee, Lily May, Paul Lau, and Wendy Sin, for their expertise and commitment. We meet bimonthly to review and plan our parish financial matters. Our accountant from the Archdiocese comes by-weekly to keep our books clean and orderly. We do our best to follow the best practices of the Archdiocese in terms of accountability and transparency.

Included in this bulletin are some highlights of the Church and school financial and ministerial report for the fiscal year ending 6/30/2018.

Highlights of 12-Month financial result:

- · Church: \$14,120 Net Operating Deficit for this period, vs. \$19,332 a year ago.
- · Collection of \$50,272 for works of charity.
- · School: \$141,885 Net Operating Deficit for this period vs. \$17,406 Surplus a year ago.

Highlights of this period's ministerial work:

- We welcomed 12 new families into our parish and had 8 children and 11 adults baptized during this period.
- Increasing emphasis was placed on Evangelization work:
 - o RCIA program welcomed 11 candidates to learn Catholic faith.
 - Outreach and Community Service programs provided volunteer service at St. James Food Pantry, Sister House and Warren Barr Senior Home.
 - Caring for the sick was emphasized e.g. Anointing of the Sick was celebrated at Mass on October 29, 2017.
 - Young Adult Ministry organized a Clothes Drive during Advent and delivered the needed goods to Franciscans of the Holy Family Custody.
- · Educational and spiritual formation programs were offered:
 - Formation sessions for parents.
 - Catholicism 201 sessions
 - Parish Pilgrimage to Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Des Plaines, IL. on October 14, 2017.
 - Liturgical Ministers Gathering & Renewal led by Fr. Li on November 12, 2017.
 - Advent Retreat, a day of reflection and sharing, led by Br. Armand Alcazar, FSC, on December 2, 2017.
 - Lenten Retreat on March 10 2018.

Your financial sacrifice and support helped our parish become financially more viable. Your dedication and commitment enabled our parish to continue its work in evangelization. I truly appreciate all you do for our parish.

Looking forward, we will continue to intentionally work on Evangelization and Missionary Discipleship. With your active participation, together, we can make our parish a truly welcoming and nourishing community of faith.

Parish Ministry Series - RCIA

'Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations' (Matt 28:19).

With great joy and humility we follow what Jesus commands us to do before His ascension. Heaven rejoices when one comes into union with the Church. RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) helps in such evangelization.

RCIA here at St. Therese is very unique. The program offers in 3 languages: English, Mandarin and Cantonese. It is a process undergone by those who are interested in entering the Catholic Faith:

- 1. Those who have not been baptized.
- 2. Those who were baptized but not yet confirmed.
- 3. Those who were baptized in other Christian Faith but desire to be in full communion with the Catholic Faith.

During the process, the candidate learns about aspects of Catholic beliefs and practices. It is also a period of reflection, prayer, instruction, discernment and formation.

Class begins in the fall (late September or early October) and on every Sunday thereafter except on some holidays. It lasts about 6 to 7 months. Candidates will enter the Catholic Faith on Easter Vigil.

There is no charge for the class. Donation to cover instructional materials is voluntary.

As followers of Jesus, we can help spread the good news to others. Why not start with our relatives and friends by inviting them to enroll in this year's RCIA?

Our Mandarin RCIA coordinator--Joyce says, "As a coordinator of Mandarin RCIA program, I have experienced continuous growing of my own faith through caring, praying and sharing of spiritual journeys. I sincerely invite Mandarin speaking parishioners at St. Therese to get involved in this ministry. With your open heart to these catechumens & candidates, it will make them feel welcomed, accepted, and gradually building a sense of belonging to the community of St. Therese.

There is NO long term commitment from you. Just one Sunday of your time will do the work. Thank you so much!"

"First in the Kingdom" by Sister Caritas

There are people in our world who are eager to be noticed, to be the first one, to have power. We can see that in our politics today. This kind of thing happens in offices, schools and often wherever there are groups of people and tasks to be performed. It can also happen in churches. To obtain power or prestige, some people do not care whom they have to hurt or what they destroy in the process of attaining their goal. Sometimes in seeking our own satisfaction or gratification we do not care whom we injure, disrespect or damage for life.

In today's Gospel, we see that the Apostles were arguing on the way. Jesus knew the discussions were about, "Who will be the greatest in the kingdom." He presents two important ideas. Jesus holds up the importance of service. He tells the Apostles, to be great is to be of service. We are called as Catholics to serve rather than making every effort to be first in line. "Good Servants" are so attentive to those they serve that they know what is needed before the one being served makes a request. In serving each other we are serving God.

The second idea Jesus presents is how we treat children. He tells us how we receive children is how we receive Him. Children as infants, are completely helpless. They depend on us for everything. As they grow, they grow in independence and the capability of caring for themselves. It is really important that they learn all the necessary things to be able to sustain a life independent of their parents, including having the economic ability to live on their own. When they are young, parents have many roles: teacher, bath giver, food preparer, driver, formation person, and one who answers all the important questions. How do we treat our children? Do we listen to them and pay attention to their actions and interests, skills and talents? Do we ignore our children never having time to listen to them, help them, teach them, or train them? We need to give them the Catholic faith, prayers, and teachings. Parents are the first evangelizers, teachers, and moral trainers of their children. Jesus tells us how we receive a child; how we treat a child is how we receive Him. "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name receives me: and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me." We ask for this gift.
