"The Gift We Receive and We Share"

Today is the last Sunday of the liturgical Year B. Next Sunday we will start a new liturgical year. It will be Year C in the three year cycle. As we begin the new liturgical year, our Liturgy Committee has planned the annual gathering for our Liturgical Minister on Sunday Dec. 2nd from 10:30am mass to 3pm. This gathering is open to all parishioners. It will be a great opportunity for us to pray, reflect and share together on the gift of the Eucharist that we all are part of it Sunday after Sunday here at St. Therese. We will have a panel of ministers who will share their experience of celebrating the Eucharist and how the Eucharist affects their everyday lives.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us how important the Eucharist is in the life of our Church and in each one of our lives as Christians.

1324 The Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life." The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Pasch." The Eucharist is the efficacious sign and sublime cause of that communion in the divine life and that unity of the People of God by which the Church is kept in being. It is the culmination both of God's action sanctifying the world in Christ and of the worship men offer to Christ and through him to the Father in the Holy Spirit."


