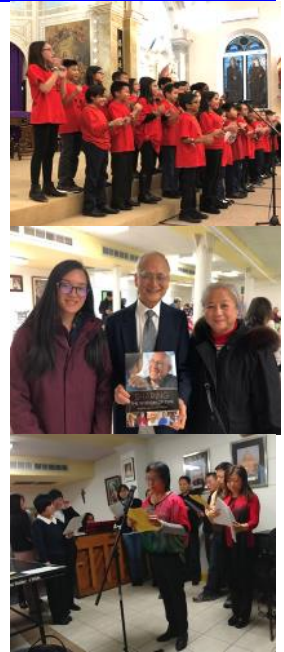

RESPECT LIFE CORNER

The Passion of St. Bakhita by Kathryn Jean Lopez

While most of us can't begin to imagine the agony victims of the clerical sexual scandal have experienced, the witness of St. Josephine Bakhita can yet give us hope. She is the modern day Sudanese slave who journeyed from sexual abuse to sainthood. Columnist Kathryn Jean Lopez's article, *The Passion of St. Bakhita*, offers a moving reflection on her life. At the age of 9 Bakhita was kidnapped near Darfur by slave traders and subjected to unspeakable treatment. Lopez writes: "It wasn't until near the end of her days when she finally spoke about the depths of brutal humiliation she suffered during [her early life]. She would later be purchased by an Italian and eventually became a Catholic and a religious sister." Bakhita, says Lopez, is a particularly appropriate patron saint for those who have suffered sexual abuse: "Those who were mistreated by priests — whose pain was only worsened by those in positions to help mishandling the dark realities before them — are martyrs of a sort, enduring such intimate violence in the wake of evil in what should be the holiest of encounters and relationships."

In his 2007 encyclical "Spes Salvi" ("Saved in Hope"), Pope Benedict XVI, the now-pope emeritus went on to present Bakhita as an "example of a saint of our time can to some degree help us understand what it means to have a real encounter with this God for the first time."

Bakhita came to know a totally different kind of "master"... Up to that time she had known only masters who despised and maltreated her, or at best considered her a useful slave. Now, however, she heard that there is a "paron" ["master" in the Venetian dialect] above all masters, the Lord of all lords, and that this Lord is good, goodness in person. She came to know that this Lord even knew her, that he had created her — that he actually loved her. She too was loved, and by none other than the supreme "Paron," before whom all other masters are themselves no more than lowly servants. She was known and loved and she was awaited.

She discovered hope. "I am definitively loved and whatever happens to me — I am awaited by this Love. And so my life is good." She came to know life as "a free child of God. She understood what Paul meant when he reminded the Ephesians that previously they were without hope and without God in the world — without hope because without God."

As the Church works for justice and truth and transparency in teaching and action, we must ask Bakhita and others to make hope overwhelming to all — especially those men and women who have been hurt by a number of clerics of the Church, and especially as children and young, vulnerable seminarians, as well. Pray, as did Pope St. John Paul II when canonizing her: "Through the intercession of St. Bakhita let us pray that all men and women will come to know the saving presence of the Lord Jesus and thus be freed from slavery to sin and death." Dear Friends,

Yesterday, the Attorney General of Illinois released a preliminary report on her investigation of the Illinois Catholic dioceses' response to the child sexual abuse crisis.

We issued a response, which you can read [here](#), but it is important that I reach out to you, our coworkers in our mission, to offer reassurance that your archdiocese takes its responsibilities to victims of clergy abuse seriously and works diligently to protect children from harm.

As many of you know, the Archdiocese of Chicago has been at the forefront of dealing with the issue of clergy sexual abuse for nearly three decades. In 1991, Cardinal Bernardin called for a dramatic change in our culture and developed a set of policies and practices that keep children safe, hold offenders accountable and ensure we act with transparency. These policies, adopted in 1992, were the model for the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People approved by the United States bishops' conference a decade later.

You may be confident that everyone who has come to the Archdioceses of Chicago with an allegation has been treated with respect and offered pastoral care. We have reported all allegations of child sexual abuse to civil authorities and investigate every allegation against an archdiocesan priest, regardless of whether the accused is alive or dead. We have published the names of diocesan priests with substantiated allegations of child sexual abuse since 2006, a time when few dioceses made this information public.

For more information on the actions the Archdiocese of Chicago has taken to address this issue, resources for victim-survivors, instructions for reporting a sexual abuse allegation, frequently asked questions about our independent review of our policies, procedures and practices, and public statements made by me and other Church leaders, please visit our [Healing and Reconciliation website](#).

Once again, we mourn the grave damage done to the many people harmed by clergy sexual abuse and stand ready to cooperate with all institutions and agencies that care for children. It can never be stated often enough: No matter where a child is educated or cared for, they are all our children and deserve to be protected.

During this holy season, as we prepare for the coming of the Christ Child in our own hearts, let us continue to pray for all those harmed by abuse. Let us reflect the light of Christ for them and be messengers of His Good News to all we encounter.

"Let Us See Your Face" by Sister Caritas

More than likely, each mother and father expecting a new child, wonders what their new child will look like. Will it resemble the mother more, or the father? Most of all, will it be healthy and have all their fingers and toes? What joy and delight they experience at the birth of their child.

The Gospel today tells of Mary's visit to Elizabeth. Seeing each other brought great joy. Elizabeth's baby 'leapt for joy.' When you have the presence of one you love, when you see their face, you are filled with joy.

The refrain of the responsorial psalm, is filled with ongoing longing and desire. It expresses the long longing of the Jewish people for the coming of the Savior. It expresses the desire of Mary and the experience of Elizabeth. When we come to know in our deepest selves, how precious and fulfilling is the knowledge, understanding, and presence of Jesus to us in our lives, we are filled with desire and longing.

Each year the liturgy of the Church helps us remember, remember again in our lives and in our deepest selves, how we long for the deep experience of having Jesus, the new born babe, born in Bethlehem, reborn in our lives in this time, in this place, 2000 years later. We continue to respond, as we draw near to Christmas, "Lord make us turn to you. Let us see your face and we shall be saved." Perhaps this can be what you carry in your mind and heart these next days. "Lord, make us turn to you. Let us see your face and we shall be saved." What a Christmas gift!
