

# **RESPECT LIFE CORNER**

### Suffering well with help from the Blessed Mother -

Most of us are wired to avoid suffering at all costs, but as Christians we are also taught to embrace our crosses. Like each of us, the Mother of God also endured immense suffering, and Fr. Jim Presta shared how we can turn to her in times of trial on Relevant Radio<sup>®</sup>.

"We suffer—that's just part of the human condition. But of course Jesus came to redeem us from sin and relieve us of that suffering, so we have hope because of Christ's suffering and death on the cross and because of his Resurrection that reminds us that we always have hope. So while we don't always understand suffering, the Christian looks at it in a very redemptive way. That suffering can help some cause in our life, it helps us in a way that we don't always understand or have always experienced. So we look to the cross of Jesus Christ; that's where we find our hope," said Fr. Presta.

Why would we look to Mary when we are going through trying times? "Imitation of Mary has been always such a hallmark of our Catholic spirituality," said Fr. Presta. He explained that Mary is not only a figure to be admired but also imitated. "To look to Mary is really to look to a role model of what redemptive suffering is all about. We don't look to Mary and say that she's a depressed mother; we call her a sorrowful mother. And that's an important distinction—we have Mary's experience of suffering presented in the context of faith, hope, and love."

Our Blessed Mother, though she was free from the stain of Original Sin, suffered in her earthly life as we do. Her sufferings were immense – we think especially during Lent to her suffering as she watched her son tortured and killed. She sat at the foot of the cross while he died, knowing that she could not intervene to save him. Through the devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows, we see her seven greatest sorrows, many relating to the Passion and death of her son. Through the guidance of Mary, we see how to look beyond our suffering and to find hope in the darkest of places.

## Illinoisans Express Overwhelming Opposition to House Dems' Abortion Bills

SPRINGFIELD - Observing what abortion advocates are successfully pushing into law in other states, thousands of Illinoisans stepped into action last week by filing witness slips online against similar proposals in the Illinois General Assembly.

In ratios of over 20 to 1, Illinoisans said they <u>opposed repealing Illinois' parental notification law (HB 2467)</u>. <u>They also</u> <u>opposed HB 2495</u>, an unprecedented proposal that would allow newborns in Illinois to die after botched abortions, minimize health department reporting, allow abortion referral fees and require private insurance companies pay for abortion procedures.

Nearly 13,370 filed witness slips in opposition to HB 2495, compared to 603 in support. Over 12,000 filed in opposition to HB 2467, compared to less than 500 in support.

Illinois Right to Life Action Chairman Ralph Rivera said he has never seen as many witness slips filed on a bill in all his time working as a lobbyist.

# US-CHINA CATHOLIC ASSOCIATION MISSION APPEAL AT ST. THERESE, MARCH 30-31



The weekend of March 30-31 representatives of the US-China Catholic Association (USCCA) will speak at all the Masses at St. Therese Chinese Catholic Mission.

The USCCA was founded 1989, during the post-Maoist era, after China had reopened to the world. It was a collaborative effort of the US bishops, Maryknoll, the Jesuits, and other religious orders who sought to build fraternal ties between the Churches in the U.S. and in China, to aid the Church in China to get back on its feet, and to provide Americans with an informed understanding of circumstances facing the Church in China.

- Mary Sluka, a native Chicagoan and long-time member of the China Association Board, will speak at the Saturday 5:00 PM Mass.
- Fr. Hugh O'Donnell, CM, who has served as Superior of the Vincentians' Midwest Province and their China Province, as well, will speak at the Sunday 8:00 AM Mass.
- Fr. Michael Agliardo, SJ, executive director of the China Association, will speak at the 10:30 AM Mass.

Over the years the USOCA has run national conferences to bring together people concerned about the Church in China, operated study tours to bring American Catholics to China to understand the realities of the Church there first-hand, and maintained various other forums (a website, a newsletter, and a speaker series) to keep U.S. Catholics informed of the inspiring story of the witness to the faith of our brothers and sisters in China.

Fr. Francis Li serves on the Board of Directors of the USCCA and has been a guiding voice as the China Association expands its work to meet the challenges of a new era. This includes greater outreach to Chinese here in the United States and providing the resources that the Church in China requires in this new era.

### SINO-VATICAN TALKS AND THE CHURCH IN CHINA TODAY

On Sunday, March 31 at 11:45 AM Fr. Michael Agliardo, executive director of the US-China Catholic Association, will speak in the parish hall of St. Therese Catholic Church about the recent accord between the Vatican and Beijing on the naming of bishops. He also will offer remarks on the wider circumstances of the Church in China today.

The Sino-Vatican accord has raised deep concern among Catholics overseas because it comes at a time when the Beijing authorities have launched a drive requiring all religions to limit outside influence and conform to the Chinese

norms. Many have criticized the accord as naïve, as a betrayal of the "underground Church" (Catholics who do not cooperate with government officials), or as a capitulation to Beijing. What are the issues at stake?

Fr. Michael is a sociologist who has taught at Boston College and Loyola University Chicago. He has also taught at the Chinese Catholic National Seminary and met with faithful Catholics throughout China.

# "HOLY GROUND" by Sister Caritas

There are a few places I have been which give me a sense that it is a "Holy" place. I am not sure what helps me to know this. Perhaps on the day I am more aware. Perhaps it is the many years of people coming there to pray. Our Lady of Lourdes in France, where Mary appeared to St. Bernadette, is such a place. Thousands of people come there to be healed. They come to pray. Other people come to serve the sick. Hundreds of people have been cured physically. Thousands no doubt, have been cured spiritually. Many people have the custom of taking off their shoes when they enter someone's home. Maybe it is not just to take care of the floors and not track in dirt from the outside. Perhaps it is also because we are entering peoples' home, peoples "holy ground."

The first reading today is the story of Moses' call. In his work as shepherd he sees a bush burning but yet the bush is not consumed. He goes to see it and a voice tells him. "Moses, come no closer. Take off your shoes for this is holy ground." Here Moses learns God's name, "I am." This experience was the start of Moses' very special relationship with God. Probably, all through his life, Moses remembered this time.

All of creation is some kind of image of God, which is "Holy Ground" as it shares in being, being alive, in existence. God, who is All Being, gives all creation a share of His Being. Each person we meet, is created in the image and likeness of God. They share in God's being. Each place can be Holy Ground. We ourselves are to be reverenced by ourselves and remembered we are created by God. We share being. We too are Holy Ground. We need to grow in awareness of this Presence of God, this Holy Ground. Perhaps this is the challenge of Lent. Recognized Holy Ground and Know God's Name "I Am."
