Lenten Regulations

(from March 6, 2019, Ash Wednesday, to the Paschal Triduum)

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

RESPECT LIFE CORNER

"God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth give way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam and the mountains quake with their surging." Psalm 46:1-3

On Wednesday, February 13, two **extreme** bills were filed in the Illinois legislature. They contain **abortion provisions**, **antihealthcare provisions** and **anti-religious freedom provisions** that are similar to bills filed in New York and other states.

What will HB 2495 and HB 2467 do?

<u>HB 2495</u> is also called the Reproductive Health Act (RHA). The corresponding IL Senate Bill is <u>SB 1942</u>. This 120 page bill makes many changes to current law, including:

Allows a procedure known as a partial-birth abortion that aborts an unborn human during the birthing process, **allows abortion for all nine months of pregnancy for any reason**, and may allow medical staff to let a newborn die if the baby is born after a failed abortion.

Requires health insurance policies to include abortions coverage, with no exemptions. This means Illinois will force churches, religious colleges, and other religious organizations to forgo health insurance or compromise their faith and have abortion included in their health insurance.

Removes some conscience protections which, depending on how a court rules, may close down all Catholic hospitals and some non-Catholic hospitals in Illinois and may force many religious doctors, nurses, etc. to stop providing healthcare in Illinois.

Allows non-doctors to abort unborn humans, allows self-abortions, removes the requirement that complications from abortions be reported to the state, allows clinics to perform an "abortion" on a non-pregnant woman who thinks she is pregnant, and allows abortion clinics to pay referral fees (like sales commissions or a kickback) when someone refers a woman to the clinic for an abortion.

<u>HB 2467</u> repeals the Illinois <u>Parental Notice of Abortion Act of 1995</u> which currently requires that an adult family member is notified before a minor has an abortion in Illinois, except in rare circumstances. The corresponding IL Senate Bill is <u>SB 1594</u>.

By repealing this law, HB 2467 allows an abortion to be hidden from parents. This undermines parents, who are responsible for their children, and **endangers young women** since parents will be unable to:

- * Inform a clinic about the health needs of the minor to avoid complications.
- * Identify and stop an abuser, sex trafficker, rapist, etc.
- * Direct the minor to a hospital instead of a poorly regulated abortion clinic.

"Judgement" by Sister Caritas

When we are teenagers, we are starting to discover all the many things we know how to do. We are learning so much about life and many different things in our world. It is easy to feel like because of our knowledge and because of the new things teens easily learn, there can be a tendency to think "we know everything." Teens may often look at adults as people who are not "with it.' They are people who prevent teens from expressing themselves, prevent them from trying new things and experimenting. Teens are so filled with energy and the newness of everything that they may sometimes have great difficulty seeing their limitations (which they believe they don't have.)

If you have ever gone to an eye doctor to get glasses, the doctor may put drops in your eyes which may distort your vision. You cannot see as clearly as you usually do. Sometimes it takes several hours to see clearly again. How distorted your vision would be if you had a "beam" in your eye. The world would surely look different and out of whack. When we look at others with judgement and condemnation we are often looking with a distorted view, with a "beam in our eye."

We are called today by Jesus to clear up our vision. Stop trying to take the splinter out of you brother's eye while the beam is still in yours. We can so easily see the faults and mistakes of others. We can judge their words and action quickly and judge them and perhaps condemn them. At the same moment we do not look at ourselves. Many spiritual writers remark that the great irritation we may feel toward another's words or actions can be an indication that we also have that fault. The reason we are upset is because we are like that person and unconsciously we actually don't want that quality in ourselves. We judge others and object to their way of acting because we recognize we are like them. We are just not willing to admit it to ourselves. Our real friends will tell us that fact.

As we approach Lent, perhaps we can stop being so critical of others. We can take the beams out of our eyes. We can work at being non-judgmental. No doubt this would make us a more happy follower of Jesus and could cut down on the criticism or backbiting in families and Churches. Look for the good in another and you will find it. Look for things to complain about and you will find those. As Jesus said last Sunday, "do not judge others and you will not be judged'. How wonderful our lives could be!
