Respect Life Corner

We Shall Not Weary – As we approach Fourth of July celebrations of our liberties and protections, let us recall that some in our number enjoy neither. Fr. Richard John Neuhaus (1936-2009), giant preacher, writer and moralist, knew that well and encouraged us to be faithful. Following are excerpts from his July 5 address at the close of the 2008 National Right to Life Conference. "We shall not weary, we shall not rest, until every unborn child is protected in law and welcomed in life. We shall not weary, we shall not rest, until all the elderly who have run life's course are protected against despair and abandonment, protected by the rule of law and the bonds of love. We shall not weary, we shall not rest, until every young woman is given the help she needs to recognize the problem of pregnancy as the gift of life. We shall not weary, we shall not rest, as we stand guard at the entrance gates and the exit gates of life, and at every step along way of life, bearing witness in word and deed to the dignity of the human person of every human person." "Against the encroaching shadows of the culture of death, against forces commanding immense power and wealth, against the perverse doctrine that a woman's dignity depends upon her right to destroy her child, against what St. Paul calls the principalities and powers of the present time, this convention renews our resolve that we shall not weary, we shall not rest, until the culture of life is reflected in the rule of law and lived in the law of love." "We do not know, we do not need to know, how the battle for the dignity of the human person will be resolved. God knows, and that is enough. As Mother Teresa of Calcutta and saints beyond numbering have taught us, our task is not to be successful but to be faithful. Yet in that faithfulness is the lively hope of success. We are the stronger because we are unburdened by delusions. We know that in a sinful world, far short of the promised Kingdom of God, there will always be great evils. "Be Open, Follow Me" by Sister Caritas

There are times when events happen and they are very bad things. If we are in the middle of the event we cannot see any good thing about the happening. It is all bad at the time. Many times in each event we eventually see something good that comes from the bad.

As Catholic Christians we are called to be people of HOPE. Jesus had to die to redeem us but He arose. We know we will rise too. The city of Chicago burned. Many people lost their homes and livelihood. With the help of skilled people, donations and effort, Chicago was rebuilt and has become what it is today. Out of the ashes came the life of a new City.

The readings today tell us of hope and new life. Elisha gave up his plowing and oxen and followed Elijah. People came to Jesus, as told in today's Gospel, and wanted to follow Jesus. They came with things they were still holding. "Let me bury the dead. Let me say good bye to my Father and Mother." Jesus calls us to let go of those objects, people, and memories we hold on to which keep us from freedom. We need to have the freedom to follow Jesus completely. If we close our hands holding something in them, we cannot receive the object someone wants to place in our hands. We must let go of what we hold so that the next thing can be placed in our hands. We need to "travel light" as we follow Jesus. If we carry a heavy suitcase we cannot move quickly. If we are free, if we have freedom of Spirit, freedom of heart, we will be able to follow Jesus everywhere.
