#### **Coronavirus, the Flu and Good Health Practices**

Given the concerns and media attention surrounding Coronavirus and the seasonal spike in flu-related illnesses, it is important that we follow good health and everyday prevention practices such as washing hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, covering a cough or sneeze with a tissue, etc. The Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) and Chicago Department of Public Health (CHPH) both maintain webpages for information about the evolving situation with Coronavirus, smart preventive measures and more. Per guidance issued by the CDPH, "there is no need for business, community, faith-based or other organizations in Chicago to take any special precautions, including organizations that may have members or employees who have travelled to China. A person who has traveled overseas to China and is well is NOT restricted from work, school or any public activities." Furthermore, the CDPH does not recommend the use of masks or gloves, any change in daily travel routines, social distancing, cancelling or avoiding mass gatherings, missing work, classes or other public events. The IDPH and CDPH, working with the Centers for Disease Control, will keep us informed of any new or additional guidance that is issued.

#### Mandarin Mass Changes:

To respond to our call to the Chinese Apostolate and to the need of our Mandarin speaking parishioners and friends, please note the following changes, effective Feb. 2020:

- Beginning on Sat. Feb. 8th, we will add a monthly Mandarin Mass on the second Saturday of the Month at 4pm followed by food and Bible Sharing.
- 2. Beginning on Sun. Feb. 23rd, 2020, the Mandarin Mass on the Fourth Sunday is moved to 12:30pm followed by luncheon and faith formation and sharing. We hope this change will ease parking challenge.

Your involvement is most welcome!

**Catholic Social Teaching** is a very important part of our tradition. It calls us to work on solidarity, the common good, and the promotion of all human dignity and be good steward for God's creation.

Below is an excerpt from Pope Francis' Encyclical *Laudato Si*, which reminds us of some of these major themes and which calls us to be more aware of our connectedness and our commitment to work for peace and justice:

- 91. A sense of deep communion with the rest of nature cannot be real if our hearts lack tenderness, compassion and concern for our fellow human beings. It is clearly inconsistent to combat trafficking in endangered species while remaining completely indifferent to human trafficking, unconcerned about the poor, or undertaking to destroy another human being deemed unwanted. This compromises the very meaning of our struggle for the sake of the environment. It is no coincidence that, in the canticle in which Saint Francis praises God for his creatures, he goes on to say: "Praised be you my Lord, through those who give pardon for your love". Everything is connected. Concern for the environment thus needs to be joined to a sincere love for our fellow human beings and an unwavering commitment to resolving the problems of society.
- 92. Moreover, when our hearts are authentically open to universal communion, this sense of fraternity excludes nothing and no one. It follows that our indifference or cruelty towards fellow 68 creatures of this world sooner or later affects the treatment we mete out to other human beings. We have only one heart, and the same wretchedness which leads us to mistreat an animal will not be long in showing itself in our relationships with other people. Every act of cruelty towards any creature is "contrary to human dignity".69 We can hardly consider ourselves to be fully loving if we disregard any aspect of reality: "Peace, justice and the preservation of creation are three absolutely interconnected themes, which cannot be separated and treated individually without once again falling into reductionism".70 Everything is related, and we human beings are united as brothers and sisters on a wonderful pilgrimage, woven together by the love God has for each of his creatures and which also unites us in fond affection with brother sun, sister moon, brother river and mother earth.

#### **Light and Salt by Sister Caritas**

Sometimes our doctors tell us, "Do not eat so much salt, or do not eat any salt." To me, a hardboiled egg does not taste the same without salt. Unsalted popcorn does not taste the same either. We are then challenged to find a substitute to make something taste good. We try other kinds of seasonings. They are good but nothing is quite like salt.

Our Gospel today calls us to be the "salt of the earth" and "the light of the world." Jesus tells us WE ARE salt and light. To live this out in our daily lives is our calling. One thing is true. You cannot give what you do not have. This means we must also have the light that is Jesus, in us, if we are to be light for others, for the world. We must have the salt, which is the life of Jesus in us, if we are to be the salt of the earth. Participating in Mass, receiving the sacraments, praying are ways God is able to transform us more completely into light for the world and salt for the earth.

The first reading makes some suggestions for us. "Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the homeless, cloth the naked, and be loving toward your own family members." Sometimes being kind to those we live with is the hardest thing. We can reach out beyond our own front door with more ease than we can listen to, care for or appreciate those of our own family. We may say, "I will shop around, and say I will go to this church or that other parish, It will be better. Eventually we return to our original parish since there we find light and can be "salt". We can think we choose where we are but more often God "puts" us there. The gifts we are, the light and salt, we are needed in those places, with these people, for this time. God knows. We are where He needs us and where we need to be. Be the salt of the earth and the light for the world. There and then we will find joy.

#### From Death to Life: Biblical Reflections on the Lenten Season a retreat with Fr. Donald Senior

The death and resurrection of Jesus stands at the heart of the New Testament and gives meaning to our Lenten observance. This retreat day will reflect on how the movement from death to life is a fundamental pattern of the Scriptures and is the basis for our hope as Christians.

Rev. Donald Senior, C.P., is President Emeritus and Chancellor of Catholic Theological Union in Chicago, where he served as president for 23 years and is now a member of the faculty as Professor of New Testament. Fr. Don was ordained a priest in 1967 and received his doctorate in New Testament studies from the University of Louvain in Belgium in 1972, with advanced studies at Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati and Harvard University. He is a frequent lecturer and speaker throughout the United States and abroad, serves on numerous boards and commissions, and is actively involved in the interreligious dialogue, particularly with the Jewish and Muslim communities. Fr. Don has published extensively on biblical topics, and he has received countless awards locally and nationally. In 2001, Pope John Paul II appointed him as a member of the Pontifical Biblical Commission, and he was reappointed in 2006 by Pope Benedict XVI and by Pope Francis in 2013.
